My business is completely dependent on access to high quality broadband service that is reliable, provided at an affordable rate and supported by a local broadband services entity. Now, the COVID-19 pandemic has increased the pressure on many businesses, increasing reliance on ecommerce, teleconference resources, and remote work arrangements.

Rural Iowa Broadband Grant applications from communications service providers should reduce or eliminate unserved and underserved areas in our community through the installation of 25/3 broadband or 100/20 broadband facilities. The Vinton Municipal Communications Utility (VMCU) will use its Iowa broadband grant funds to provide much needed 1 Gigabit downstream and 1 Gigabit upstream broadband service to the Vinton, Iowa business community and the area covered under this application.
