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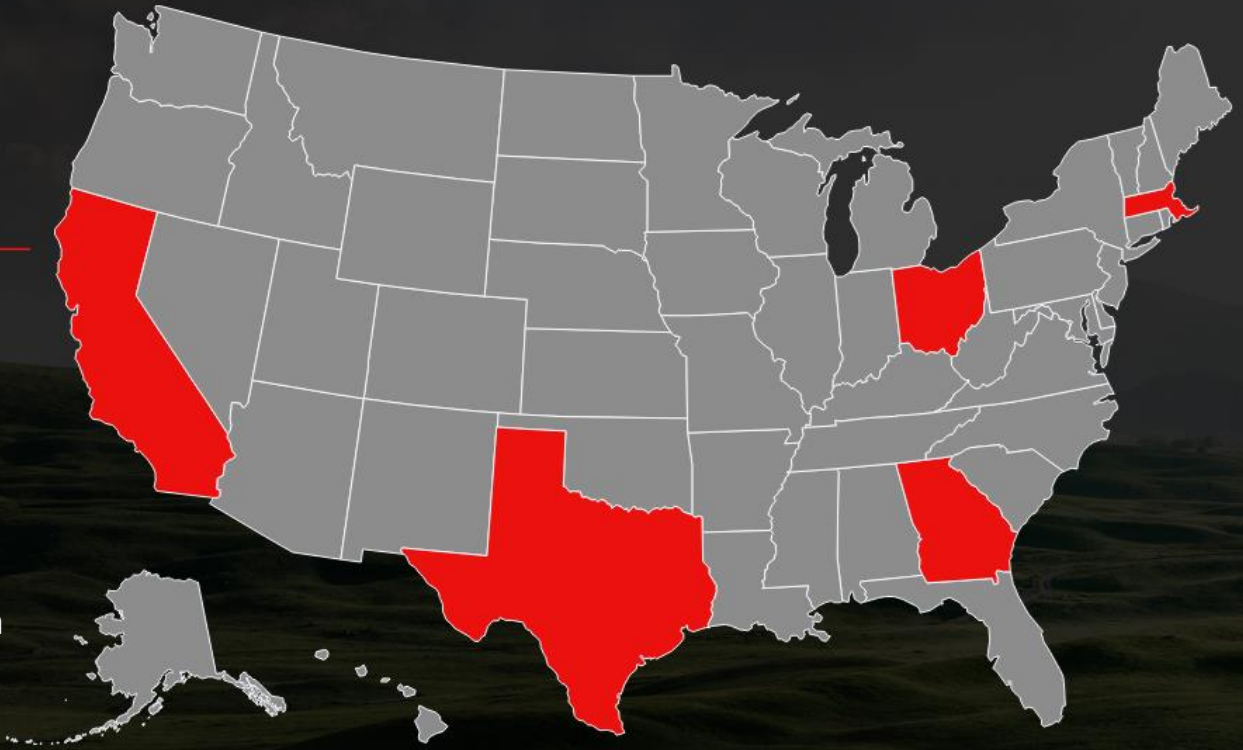


Key Reform Opportunities

1. Improving and expanding data collection efforts
2. Banning race-based pretextual stops
3. Promoting government transparency and public outreach
4. Enhancing the use of crisis response strategies and alternatives to arrest
5. Instituting effective law enforcement training

STATE LEGISLATION: WHERE WE ARE

According to a state bill tracking database run by the National Conference of State Legislatures, over 440 policing bills have been introduced in 2020, with 35 states introducing some form of policing legislation this year.
